Colorado River Toad



OVERVIEW



- · Scientific Name: Incilius alvarius
- Origin: South-West United States and Northern Mexico
- Ease of Care: Intermediate
- · Potential Adult Size: Up to 8 inches
- · Life Span: Upwards of 10 years
- Behaviour: Nocturnal
- · Diet: Insectivore
- Humidity: 40-60%
- Handling: Advanced (due to potential harmful toxic secretions)







TOP TIPS

- Provide a shallow water bowl as the Colorado River Toad drinks water through its skin. All tap water must be treated with a water conditioner.
- ✓ Provide a substrate that aids holding humidity.
- ✓ Add live plants to help maintain humidity.

Heating: Heat BulbLighting: UV Tube (Light Cycle: 12 hours of light)

EQUIPMENT NEEDED

- Substrate: HabiStat Jungle Bio, HabiStat Coir, or Arcadia EarthMix
- · Water: Water Bowl

Housing: Terrarium

HOUSING



The HabiStat Glass Terrarium 60x45x45cm (HGT6045) is ideal for the species throughout its life. The Colorado River Toad is a communal species, this size enclosure would be suitable for 1 or 2 of Toads.

Heating

The Colorado River Toad (Incilius alvarius) is an ectothermic (cold-blooded) animals and take all their heat requirements from external sources.

Heating a Vivarium

- Background Temp: 21°C-23°C (70-73°F)
- HOT Spot: 24-27°C (75-81°F)
- Night-Time Temp: 18°C (65°F)

Provide a warmer/hot area at one end of the enclosure, using an overhead heat source to offer a heat gradient. Use an Arcadia Reflector Clamp Lamp with Ceramic Holder (RARTG75) and a HabiStat Heat Bulb (HBB50) running in conjunction with a HabiStat Dimming Thermostat (HTDW).

Dimming thermostats are designed to regulate temperatures using a thermostat probe (also known

as a sensor). Correct placement of the probe is critical to avoid overheating and injury to the Animal. Maintain night-time temperatures using a HabiStat Heat Mat (HHMA17) running through a HabiStat Mat Stat (HTMW1) if they are dropping below the recommended.

Check temperatures regularly, using a reliable dual thermometer and hygrometer to ensure that there are no extreme fluctuations.

Lighting

Place the Arcadia ShadeDweller Pro T5 7% (RARTP8S) on the mesh roof of the Terrarium. This will supply realistic UVB levels within the enclosure. Ensure that it is fitted correctly and within the manufacturers recommend distances.

Substrates and Decoration

Personal choice will dictate how you decorate your enclosure, but we recommend the following as examples:

- HabiStat Jungle Bio (HSJB10), HabiStat Coir (HS10F), or Arcadia EarthMix (RARE10)
- HabiStat Cork Branch (HDB1), HabiStat
 Grapevine (HSGV), and the HabiStat Log Hideout
 (HSNLHL) will offer shelter and enrichment
 within the enclosure.
- Live or artificial plant decoration will provide darker areas for the animal to use as shelter.

DIET & WATER



Ensure the Colorado River Toad has a varied diet, with a mixture of insects throughout its lifetime.

Insects such as Fruit-Fly (LFF), Crickets (HOUSECR),
Locust (LCST), and Roaches (LDL8) are some of their favourites.

Always provide a fresh source of water, such as the HabiStat Plastic Shallow water Bowl (HWFSL).

This water should be treated with a water conditioner, to remove any chlorine that could cause harm to your Toad.

To maintain and regulate humidity within the enclosure, mist as required.

SUPPLEMENTATION



The Colorado River Toad needs additional supplementation in the form of a calcium and multi-vitamin powder such as Arcadia Earth Pro-A (RAREP100) and Arcadia Earth Pro Calcium Mg (RAREPCM80). Follow the on-pack instructions.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION



- The Colorado River Toad has harmful toxin glands called the paratoid glands just behind their eyes. The toxin produced by the Toad can cause harm in humans, as well as other animals. Avoid handling them unless necessary.
- Surgical gloves should always be worn if handling is required.

HEALTH & HYGIENE



We recommend the following cleaning routine to keep your Colorado River Toad healthy and happy:

| | Water | Substrate | Enclosure |
|---------|----------------------------------|---|---|
| Daily | Change old water for fresh water | Spot clean | Check vents on enclosure are not blocked and allow air to pass through freely |
| Weekly | Disinfect water bowl or dish | Agitate substrate to prevent any bacterial build up and to allow any dirty bedding to be removed | Wipe down glass and walls with a reptile safe disinfectant |
| Monthly | | Take out old substrate and replace with new substrate | Wipe down inside the enclosure and disinfect décor with a reptile safe disinfectant |

Always wash your hands, surfaces and equipment with warm water and disinfectant immediately before and after handling your animal, their food, enclosure, and any other equipment.

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
